Pastor's Page

Pray—Plan—Participate *Stewardship Emphasis 2011*

Fall is a great time of year! As you drive through the country side, you see the farmers out harvesting their crops, row upon row of corn and soybeans. These fruits of the earth come as a gift of God's abundant grace. With God, there is always an abundance, an abundance of food, of family and friends, of forgiveness and mercy. God gives to us everything we need for our physical and spiritual needs, day by day, year by year. Out of God's abundance we are able to share with others. We call that stewardship. We are to be good stewards of God's abundant gifts.

Our stewardship theme this year is, "**Pray – Plan – Participate.**" As members of United Lutheran Church, we give of our financial resources to support the ministry that we are a part of. As responsible church members, we want to support our church, carryout our ministry, and cover our operating expenses. But beyond that we discover great joy in giving because we realize that what we are doing is God pleasing and meeting the needs of many people. Being a good giver does not just happen. There is a process to becoming a good steward.

The first step is always to **PRAY**. Pray that the Holy Spirit will open you up to this important ministry. We ask in prayer that we might have our will come in line with God's will, that we might fulfill God's purpose for us in our lives. In Philippians 4:6, The Apostle Paul says, "Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God." Paul says in 1 Thessalonians, "Pray without ceasing."

The second step is to **PLAN**. The Apostle Paul urges us to think about it and plan for it, to make our gift in response to the many blessings that God has given to us and in proportion to the gifts we have received. In 1 Corinthians Paul says, "On the first day of the week, each of you is to put something aside and store it up, as he or she may prosper, so that the contributions need not be made when I come." According to Paul, our giving should be:

Regular: *On the first day of the week.*



Systematic: *put something aside.*

Planned out in advance: *and store it up...so that contributions need not be made when I come.*

Proportionate: *as he or she may prosper.*

Much of this relates to another biblical practice called *tithing*. It is a voluntary, systematic way of contributing to the financial support of the church. Its roots are found in the Old Testament where the guideline for giving was 10% of one's income or property.

Finally, we **PARTICIPATE**, regardless of the amount. It is always our goal to have 100% participation from our membership. If everyone participates we will have more than enough to carry out our mission and ministry, bringing many thanksgivings to God through the good works that we do.

Remember, Stewardship Sunday is November 20. Please pray, plan, and participate in this year's stewardship ministry.

Why Do You Worry?

"There fore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? Look at the birds of the air; they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? And can any of you by worrying add a single hour to your span of life? And why do you worry about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they neither toil nor spin, yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like one of these. So do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will bring worries of its own. Today's trouble is enough for today." Matthew 6:25-29, 34.

This is one of my favorite passages from the Bible, yet one of the most difficult to obey. Who amongst us does not worry? Yet we have direct instructions from God NOT to worry. And medical experts have something to say on the subject, too.

Worrying can wear you out. Before you let everyday worries weigh you down, consider these questions.

What, exactly, am I worried about?

What am I predicting will happen?

How likely is it that this will happen?

How will things seem a few weeks or months from now?

What is the worst possible outcome? Could I survive it?

Is there something I can do to prevent that outcome?

If the answer to the last question is yes, take whatever appropriate action you can to address the problem. For instance, if finances are your concern, maybe start by creating a budget. If the answer to

the last question is no, your mission is to manage your worry. Try these strategies.

Create a diversion. Clean the basement. Go for a walk. Work in the garden. Meditate or pray.

Talk it out. Share your problems with a close friend who can help you gain perspective.

Create a daily "worry time". Maybe you will "worry" from 5 p.m. to 5:15 p. m. each day. If you start to fret about something at a different time, post-poned it until the designated worry time.

Adopt a physically active lifestyle. Exercise is a wonderful way to manage stress.

I realize that some burdens are truly enormous and these tricks may not suffice. But these suggestions to deal with every day cares may be helpful.

Now those of you who know me well are probably smiling to yourselves and thinking, "Practice what you preach, Verna!" Yes, I, too, can get bogged down with worry. My worries usually crop up in the middle of the night, and they are almost always about things over which I have absolutely no control! My best diversion when this happens is to get up and read something to take my mind off the troublesome thoughts.

If none of these strategies seems to work and you find yourself increasingly anxious, you may have an anxiety disorder. Talk with your doctor or a licensed mental health provider.

My prayers are for peace of mind and comfort in times of stress. Remember the lilies!
