

## Confirmation Faith Project

This year you have a few options for your confirmation project. Since people learn in many different and unique ways, we want you to be able to express yourself in the way you are most comfortable.

So, what does that mean? If you like to write, do a faith statement or paper. If you like to draw, paint, sing, act, we encourage you to use that talent to express your faith. If you want to put a powerpoint together or scrapbook, go for it. Below you will find some questions to help you think about your faith and get started. If you have any questions or need help thinking of an idea, talk to Amanda or Pastor Justin.

After thinking through and jotting down a few answers to the questions. Come up with a plan for what you would like to do for your project. **Final projects are due in September of 2020**

### Questions:

1. Describe your faith in God right now. Be honest! Is it strong, important, confusing, unsure? Why?
2. What is your first memory of church?
3. Who are/were the people who brought you to church
4. Who are the people that have impacted your faith? Ex. parents, friends, mentors, others. What about them was impactful? Something they did, or said, or shared with you.
5. Talk to your family and other faith mentors ask them about their faith and why it matters to them.
6. What event (happy or sad) in your life has really shaped your faith or trust in God? Describe how it affected you.
7. Who are the people in your life who have helped you on your faith journey? How have they helped?
8. Think about your experiences at church (confirmation, youth activities, Sunday School, worship, etc.). What are some things you think you will remember for a long time, why?
9. What is your favorite bible story, why? What about it sticks out for you?
10. Look through the Bible and pick out a verse that means something to you. Why is it important to you? Do a little research and see what is the background of that part of Scripture? Who wrote it, to who, at what time in history? How can those words speak to us today?
11. What gifts and talents has God blessed you with? How are you using them to share the love of God with your church, family and community? How do you imagine them being used in the future?
